With today's economical situation Mr Brit knew that this section of the guide needed as much attention to detail as possible. The other half of **Mr Brit's Guide To Orlando 2009** (and the most fun) is the theme parks chapters. The rides and shows of the Orlando theme parks have been covered in great detail, accompanied by specific tips and an attraction ranking system - **Mr Brit's 5 Star Rating**. At the end of each theme park review is a great little section named "*if you had just one day in...*" and this does exactly what it says on the tin. Mr Brit says "With the theme park entrance alone costing over £40 per person for a one day visit, Francis wanted to prioritise what a **one day visitor** needs to do or avoid in the theme parks in order to get the most value and the best experience from the theme parks.

This guide is really an "all Brit's need to know about Orlando" guide with attention to even the smallest things such as **what is a Corn Dog or a Churro?** The American culture is very similar to British culture in some respects but a world away in others such as food, tipping and phrases. Also included is a chapter dedicated to "driving on the wrong side of the road". Mr Brit translates some of the American ways of doing things that aren't that familiar to us Brit's.
